### Lesson Four Vocabulary Words

**Government:** the office, authority, or functioning organization that makes laws and controls a political unit such as a city, state, or country. (Recommended Vocabulary K-9, Qatar English Standards, Grade 7)

**Guilty:** responsible for having committed a crime. (Recommended Vocabulary K-9, Qatar English Standards, Grade 9)

**Executive Authority:** the power to enforce laws. In Qatar, executive authority is held by the H.H. the Emir and the Council of Ministers.

**Innocent:** not responsible for having committed a crime. (Recommended Vocabulary K-9, Qatar English Standards, Grade 9)

**Judicial Authority:** the power to interpret the meanings of laws as applied to specific cases, as in judges in the courts of law.

**Legislative Authority:** the power to make laws. In Qatar legislative authority is held by the Advisory Council, in consultation with H.H. the Emir and his ministers.

**Traffic:** the vehicles and pedestrians moving along a route. (Recommended Vocabulary K-9, Qatar English Standards, Grade 6)

**Vehicle:** a device with wheels used to transport people or objects. (Recommended Vocabulary K-9, Qatar English Standards, Grade 7)

## No Vehicles in the Park



The city of Umm Khor established a lovely new park last year. Park goers have complained about **traffic** in the area, which creates noise, pollution, and safety hazards for those walking, playing, and picnicking along the park paths. Two people were almost hit by cars in the park last week! The local **government** wishes to make the park safer and more pleasant for visitors hoping to enjoy a natural environment with open grassy spaces, trees, flowers, and quiet. The municipal council, which enacts laws for the city, recently passed a ban on **vehicles** in the park, hoping to fix the traffic problem. Signs reading “No Vehicles in the Park” were posted at all entrances to the park. The municipal council did not offer any other information about the new law, simply saying, “No more vehicles in the park.”

**Instructions:** Use the story above to answer the following questions. Be prepared to explain your answers.

1. Why did the municipal council of Umm Khor decide to ban vehicles from the park? What is the new law designed to do? What is the intent of the new law?

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2. The municipal council did not explain what they meant by “vehicles,” so let’s review the definition:

**Vehicle:** a device with wheels used to transport people or objects. (Recommended Vocabulary K-9, Qatar English Standards, Grade 7)

Using this definition of “vehicle,” what do you think the municipal court meant? Why?

## You Be the Judge

## Should This Law Be Changed?
